

SCHEDULE PICK-UP/LOCKER SET UP –Thursday, AUGUST 13, 2015

- 6th grade last names beginning A – L → 8:30 AM – 10:00 AM meet in Commons
- 6th grade last names beginning M – Z → 1:30 PM – 3:00 PM meet in Commons
- 7th and 8th grades 11:30 – 12:30 PM → 7th grade report to Commons
8th grade report to front lobby

7th & 8th grader schedules will not be available during 6th grade orientation.

There will NOT be a make-up time for schedule pick-up, so please try to be here on August 13. If students are unable to attend, they will pick up their schedules the first day of school – August 24, 2015. ALL students will receive a new schedule the first day of school.

Locker shelves (\$10) and spirit wear will be available for purchase at orientation. Please bring cash or checks. Unfortunately, we will not be able to accept bills larger than \$20. Parents will also be able to put money on student lunch accounts.

On August 24, 2015, the first day of school, 6th graders will report directly to the Commons, 7th graders to gym 1, and 8th graders to gym 2. When they arrive on campus they should check the lists for their advisory teacher's name, as sometimes these teachers change from orientation to the first day of school. At 8:50 am they will be released to their advisory teacher for the morning. The first days of school we will hold Falcon Camp for all students. During this camp they will learn school wide expectations, get agendas, textbooks, and get a tour of the building. Remember, traffic is always heavy the first day of school. Please plan accordingly, the building opens at 8:00 am.

Please note:

Students are not allowed to use tape, double sided or other types, contact paper, use stickers or hang things from inside of lockers due to the damage these items have caused. Students are not allowed to write on lockers with anything, not even dry erase or special markers. All of these things will damage the paint.

Immunization Requirements

Immunization requirements for incoming 7th graders...

- ◆ Second Varicella (documented history of the chicken pox disease will suffice)
- ◆ Meningitis vaccine
- ◆ Tdap vaccine given within the last 5 years

Parents, please be aware that students who do not have a current immunization record on file, in the clinic, will not be allowed to pick up their schedule or books or attend classes until a current immunization record has been turned in...no exceptions. If you have not already done so, please submit a copy of your child's updated immunization record as soon as possible.

Students who require medication while at school . . .

Parents, please do not send medication to school, with your child, and expect them to bring it to the clinic. All medication needs to be brought to the clinic by a parent and the appropriate paperwork needs to be filled out and signed, by you, before any medication will be given. Also, all medication must be in the original container and must not be expired.

Texas Music Educators' Association Honor Band Competition

The FSMS Band submitted a recording to the Texas Music Educators' Association Honor Band Competition at the end of the school year. This competition occurs every two years and there are two elimination rounds, Region and Area, before reaching the state level competition. At each elimination round, the top two bands advance to the next level of competition. On June 9th, the region competition took place at Dulles HS and all five judges put the FSMS Band in 1st place, which means we advanced to the area level competition. The area competition was held on June 26th in New Braunfels and the FSMS Band placed first in the area and will now be competing at the state level competition in San Antonio on July 23rd in conjunction with the annual Texas Bandmasters' Association Convention. At the state level, there will only be 14 CCC middle school bands remaining in this statewide competition. Congratulations to the students for this outstanding accomplishment!

Football Season

Attention 7th and 8th grade football parents:



Football starts the first day of school on August 24. All of your equipment will be provided by Fort Bend I.S.D. The athletes will get their equipment on the first day of school. Athletes can provide their own shoes and helmets, but if you want to use your own helmet, you **MUST** provide a doctor's note and we have to inspect the helmet to insure it is safe. It must not be more than 7 years old and it must have a NOCSAE seal stamped on it. (Bring your completed physical form at that time).

You must have a physical exam form turned in to the Fort Settlement coaches before you can participate. One physical is good for all sports for one calendar year. All other forms must be completed and turned in online, these can be found in rank one sport on the weebly.

You will be expected to be present and on time for all games and practices. We practice every day after school, 4:00-5:45 PM. Everyone will be placed on either the "A" or "B" team. The first four days of school the boys will need a pair of athletic shorts and a shirt. There is a state mandated four day period with no pads so the boys can get acclimated to the heat. PE uniforms will be sold for \$20.00 a pair if needed.

We look forward to working with the athletes and parents of 2015 – 2016 and continuing the winning attitude and success of Fort Settlement Falcon Athletics. Enjoy your summer and we hope to see you on the field in the fall.


